FACULTY

Lewis & Clark has 112 tenured and tenure-track faculty members and 17 faculty with term in the College of Arts and Sciences. Ninety-eight percent of the continuing faculty have the terminal degree in their field of expertise. Each year approximately 20 faculty members are away from campus for one or two semesters on sabbatical leave or as leaders of overseas groups. During their absence they are replaced by qualified visiting faculty. In addition, several part-time faculty members supplement the full-time faculty.
